-A Walking Tour of Franklin D. Murphy Sculpture Garden led by Vicki Steele

Attendees will be guided by Vicki Steele on a walking tour of the Franklin D. Murphy Sculpture Garden. The Garden is a nine-minute walk, or you can take a shuttle from the UCLA University Club. The Murphy Sculpture Garden is one of the most distinguished outdoor sculpture installations in the country. It will end at 5:30 p.m. with a walk back to The Inn. Please wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat!

Dedicated in 1967 by UCLA's third chancellor, Franklin D. Murphy with over 70 sculptures by Hans Arp, Deborah Butterfield, Alexander Calder, Barbara Hepworth, Jacques Lipchitz, Henry Moore, Auguste Rodin, and David Smith.

Bio: Victoria (Vicki) Steele, Emerita of the Year Award for 2020, PhD in Art History from USC. For over 40 years Vicki directed UCLA's Special Collections.

-Tour of the Fowler Museum Exhibition *Mountain Spirits*

The tour will begin at 4:15 p.m. and a shuttle will pick up attendees at the UCLA University Club to take them to the Fowler Museum. A Travel Escort will meet tour attendees outside the Club. Attendees will participate in a guided tour led by museum staff exploring the exhibition *Mountain Spirits: Rice and Indigeneity in the Northern Luzon Highlands, Philippines*. Visitors will immerse themselves in this world through carved guardians, ritual bowls, woven blankets, farming tools, soundscapes, and video installations. Together, these works reveal how sustenance and spirituality are entwined, and how generosity, labor, and environmental care nurture Ifugao life. The tour will end at 5:45 p.m. and the shuttle will pick up attendees to return them to The Inn.
