# UCSF Emeriti Faculty Association

## Report of activities, May 2019 – October 2019

### Membership and Support

As of October 8, 2019, UCSF reports a total of 1,213 eligible emeriti faculty members. This includes 788 Emeritus Faculty and 425 Retired Faculty who have been included on our contact list.

This year our membership mailing will be processed by our Documents and Media Department and is scheduled to drop by the end of October, 2019. The mailing will be sent to 1140 available contacts.

As of September 21, 2019, there were 30 paid members. Complimentary membership stands at approximately 5. In addition to membership fees, UCSF EFA receives financial support from the UCSF Provost's office. \$5000 will be provided annually. Logistic support and publication services are provided by the Alumni University Development and Alumni Relations Office. The venue for all EFA events is the UCSF Alumni and Faculty House.

### EMERITIDINGS

EFA's newsletter EMERITIDINGS is issued online 3 times per year. The newsletter features announcements of upcoming programs sponsored by the EFA, campus and system-wide developments of interest to retired faculty, proceedings of system-wide Council meetings, and information about competitive research grants and awards available to emeriti.

## UC San Diego Retirement Association Report Highlights of Activities 2019

1. The UC San Diego Retirement Association continues its active roles, both as a stand-alone organization and in close partnership with the 620 plus member UC San Diego Emeriti Association. The two organizations share facilities in the UCSD Retirement Resource Center under the able direction of Suzan Cioffi. This facility provides space for many activities, meetings, and the UC Emeriti Association mentoring program for UCSD's Chancellor's Scholars.
2. Membership of the UC San Diego Retirement Association has is now **just shy of 2,600**, the largest in the UC system. Dues for annual and life memberships remain at \$30 and \$300, respectively.
3. The Retirement Association Gazette, the organization's newsletter, is published nine times each year and is in an 12-page, full-color newsletter format, often with 1 or 2-page double-sided, year-long program pull-out sections. The Gazette contents include details about upcoming activities, requests for volunteers, a President's Message, and a calendar of events. Now, about 65% of our members opt to receive the UCSD Retirement Association Gazette electronically. Additionally, the RA distributes information about its events via its Facebook page, and Google Calendar. The RA publishes a weekly events calendar email "*Next Week at the UCSD Retirement Association*", listing all events for the coming week, with relevant time/place/cost/RSVP details included, with a link to the E-Gazette and various seminar series at the bottom of the message. This is a VERY popular service.
4. The UCSD Retirement Association completely redesigned its website in 2018. See: <http://retirement.ucsd.edu>.
4. The Retirement Association offers three list-serv choices; one for all campus flyers plus RA and benefits news, one for UCSD-RA and benefits news, and the third limited to the electronic distribution of the Gazette.
5. The UC-RA has a large group of active volunteers who contribute in excess of 1,000 hours to staff over 20 different events on the UCSD campus each year. The volunteer Board and Committee members provide approximately 700 hours of volunteer service time to various meetings throughout the year. The "Gazette Groupies" (12 volunteers each month) provide another 500 hours to handle post-production of the Gazette. Total RA volunteer hours exceed 5,000 this year. Additionally, numerous UCSD Retirement Association members are actively engaged as volunteers in the Preuss School Mentoring Program, the International Center's Resale Shop, and the Theatre and Dance Ushers Program, and in various off campus programs, bringing RA Volunteering totals to over 10,000 hours!
6. The Membership Committee staffs a Membership Outreach table at various events on campus throughout the year and several times each year at both Medical Centers. These outreach efforts have been key to increasing memberships numbers. **RA membership is just shy of 2,600 members, and is on track to surpass 2,700 by mid-June!**
7. The Program Committee organizes numerous activities annually that include community tours, a free international film series – with new films presented each month by distinguished professors, campus tours, educational seminars (health and financial topics, monthly ethnic restaurant luncheons, distinguished lecture series, and special events on campus and out in the community. In addition, there are several annual events that members look forward to (summer BBQ, festive holiday party, spring volunteer appreciation luncheon). **Program offerings range from 15 to 30 each month!** An online RSVP system debuted last year, which generates a confirmation email to each registrant, and a roster of event attendees for check in. It has greatly streamlined our event administration.
8. Regular weekly or monthly Interest Groups/classes include the following: Spanish language conversation group, a creative writing group, a Fiction Book Club, a Healthy Living/Healthy Eating Interest Group, an Investments Interest Group, and an active Walking Group. Our Healthy Living/Healthy Eating Interest Group continues to include useful seminars on Nutrition and a free quarterly meditation sessions.
9. The amount that the UC Retirement Association regularly contributes to the Chancellors Scholarship fund is \$7000 annually and it makes a \$1,000 award to Nursing / Health Sciences, and an additional \$900 sponsorship to the UCSD International Center to support study-abroad scholarships. The recipients of these funds attend luncheons to accept the awards. Additionally, the Retirement Association set up a Chancellor's Scholars individual donor fund, to which an additional \$1,000 was donated last year.
10. A number of UCSD RA members are also actively involved as mentors with the Emeriti Mentor Program. That program provides mentoring to some 80 freshmen and sophomore Chancellor's Scholars, and 80 upper div scholars.
11. The UC RA Board of Directors serves as advocates for the University among new retirees.

## UC San Diego Emeriti Association Report Fall 2019

1. Membership in the UC San Diego Emeriti Association has maintained 615 active members. Each year, the Emeriti Association hosts a special reception for potential members, now in February, along with other outreach activities. This has usually led to a good number of prospective retirees joining the Association at the end of the academic year. Dues for annual and life memberships remain at \$30 and \$300, respectively. However, new joiners are offset by attrition and deaths.
2. The Emeriti Association's Book Club meets once per month at the Faculty Club to discuss a book selected by one of the Book Club members. The member who proposes the book will also serve as lead discussant at that meeting.
3. Partnering with the Center for Student Involvement (CSI), the UCSD Emeriti Association's Emeriti Mentor Program (EMP) co-sponsors the Chancellor's Scholars Program (CSP) to provide first generation college students, two years' communication and leadership training, as well as one-on-one mentoring. Some forty-five emeriti faculty serve as mentors to forty freshmen and forty second-year mentees. Many mentors continue with their mentees for the whole 4-year undergraduate experience. Participation in this program has enriched the experience for all of our mentees, as well as our mentors. This year, in addition to their mentoring activities, emeriti have donated \$120,000 to the Chancellor's Scholarship fund. CSP/EMP administrators have academic data for students participating in the prior 10 years. This data shows average GPAs of 3.4 – 3.5, compared to 3.0 – 3.1 of all UCSD students. Clearly Chancellor's Scholars are benefiting from participation in the program.
4. Some twenty Emeriti mentors attended the Opening Kick-Off BBQ for the Chancellor's Scholars Program and thirty mentors attended the Opening Reception for the Freshman Cohort. Attached on page two of this report is a photo of the Emeriti Mentors who attended the Opening and of the Freshman Cohort.
5. The Emeriti Association continues its close partnership with the nearly 2700 member UCSD Retirement Association. This relationship is supported by the excellent coordination efforts of Suzan Cioffi, Director of the UCSD Retirement Resource Center, and by the physical resources of the Center, a well-equipped facility located in the heart of the campus. As a result, emeriti are able to participate in the Retirement Association's many interest groups. Emeriti Association members have become active participants in RA activities such as a wide array of senior and financial education seminars; a monthly international film presentation; health and wellness; international travel; and elder-care discussion groups; an Investments Interest Group; and a Walking Group, to name just a few. Emeriti faculty also give lectures as part of the Emeriti monthly lecture series held at the Center.
6. During the academic year, the Emeriti Association continues to offer its now-quarterly seminar open to all members and advertised to current faculty, and now to members of the Retirement Association and Chancellor's Scholars as well. Speakers are faculty members from the full range of academic disciplines. Light refreshments are served and, in addition to providing a rewarding intellectual experience, the seminars offer emeriti an opportunity to socialize with one another on a regular basis. Attendance at these monthly seminars has regularly been between 50 and 60.
7. Emeriti Association members enjoy having access to an online event RSVP website, with detailed event flyers and a user-friendly online registration tool which generates a confirmation email upon registration.
8. The Emeriti Association's website was redesigned in Spring 2018, and is a valuable resource for our members. Please see: <http://emeriti.ucsd.edu>. Information about the Emeriti Mentor Program, Emeriti Awards, membership, the Chronicles, and a link to the Emeriti RSVP website can all be found there.
9. Our quarterly newsletter, the *Chronicles*, superbly edited by Sandy Lakoff, can be found on our website by clicking on "Chronicles" at the top.

#### **Members**

### **Honors**

**UCSC Emeriti Association** received a \$50,000 endowment, the **Edward and Miriam Landesman Emeriti Endowment**, bearing the names of the donors. Ed Landesman, Professor Emeritus of Mathematics, cited the work the EA is doing for all Emeriti, fighting for Emeriti rights and benefits, investigating improper actions by the Administration and UCOP, and providing a voice and visibility for Emeriti. Annual income from the endowment will support the activities of the Emeriti Association, such as video of our luncheon talks, managing social media, and other technical aspects required.

**Leo Laporte**, Professor Emeritus of Earth and Planetary Sciences received the Mary C. Rabbitt Award in the History of Geology from the geological Society of America. LaPorte’s teaching and publications re Chas. Darwin and George G. Simpson have been incorporated into Univ. Okla. Hist. of Sci. Collections (Geology) 2019.

**Michael Nauenberg**, Professor Emeritus Physics was honored by the UCSC Emeriti Association creating the annual Michael Nauenberg History of Science Lecture. Nauenberg was one of the preeminent experts in the work of Isaac Newton. This lecture will bring outstanding Historians of Science to UCSC for a public lecture to which students are invited. Nauenberg believed undergraduates need to learn the history of how the science came to be what it is, not just the final result. Nauenberg published his last paper a couple days before he passed away July 22, 2019 at the age of 84.

**Angela Davis**, Distinguished Professor Emerita, History of Consciousness and Feminist Studies, was inducted into the National Women’s Hall of Fame in September 2019. Davis has been a champion of civil rights and women’s rights. Her academic studies focused on the prison industrial complex and international justice.

**Donna Haraway**, Distinguished Professor Emerita, History of Consciousness, was elected as a Fellow of the British Academy in July 2019. Her research and teaching focused on science and technology studies, feminist theory, and multispecies studies.

**Joel Primack.** Distinguished Professor, Physics, was awarded the 2020 Julius Edgar Lilienfeld Prize by the American Physical Society. The prize recognized his seminal contributions to our understanding of the formation of structure in the universe and for communicating to the public the extraordinary progress in our understanding of cosmology.

### **Newsletter 1-4 and 2-1 Published**

Emeriti have contributed 34 articles about themselves or their research, averaging about 6 articles each issue. The Newsletter continued its investigative reporting about how the Emeriti Association convinced the Chancellor to restore Emeritus status for Michael Nauenberg on April 3, 2019. Nauenberg passed away on July 22, 2019. Another story showed that the Academic Senate Committee on Emeriti Relations (CER) continues to be composed of newly retired Emeriti (average 2 or less years) whereas the average Emeriti have been retired 12 years.

Several articles describe Emeriti efforts to protect the campus East Meadow from being developed. Another article documented UCSC's refusal to produce documents requested via the California Public Records Act and it disclosed the invoices (obtained from the shredding company) for the S&E Library shredding of 80,000 volumes. Pictures of Chancellor Blumenthal's last Emeriti Luncheon included the cake, a student choral group, and a plaque signed by Emeriti. The summer Sailing Regatta pictures were also included. Wipke, the Founding Editor, has given a high priority to publishing pictures, representing the human side of being Emeriti. Issue 2-2 will appear October 31. ## ***Spring 2019 Get-Together***

The annual Spring Get-Together was held at the Mosher Alumni House on April 9, 2019, in conjunction with the UCSB Retirees' Association, with 45 emeriti and retirees attending. Following a social hour Marc McGinnes, Professor Emeritus and a founding member of UCSB's Environmental Studies Program spoke about his new book, "In Love with Earth: Testimonies and Heartsongs of an Environmental Elder." From the time he saw the 1969 Apollo 8 Earthrise photo, Marc McGinnes has been a champion for the planet. In the aftermath of the 1969 Santa Barbara oil blowout and spill, he organized the first Environmental Rights Day in 1970 that led to the first Earth Day observances. He co-founded the Community Environmental Council, The Environmental Defense Center, the Peaceful Resolutions Institute and the Community Mediation Council. Since 1971 he has won numerous teaching awards as a faculty member of the Environmental Studies Program at UCSB. Marc will be the after-dinner speaker at the CUCEA/CUCRA meetings at UCSB in Spring 2020.

## ***UCSB Emeriti Association Research Awards***

Thanks to the generosity of our members, the UCSB Emeriti Association has long supported undergraduate research. Such support was again channeled through the UCSB Undergraduate Research slam, held on May 9, 2019. The Slam offers students the chance to give dynamic, three-minute oral presentations of their research or creative activity to a panel of judges. After the preliminary round with 50 participants, 15 finalists were selected to present at the final round. The Emeriti Association funded two \$1000 awards. The Emeriti Award went to Hillary Ta, a biology major in the College of Letters & Science. The People's Choice Award went to Aaron Nguyen, a mechanical engineering major in the College of Engineering. Professor Emerita Merith Cosden was among the judges.

Since the April 2019 CUCEA meeting, the UCREA has continued to meet on a monthly basis, with new officers starting their two year terms on July 1, 2019. The new officers are: Doug Mitchell, president; Darleen DeMason and Raymond Russell, co-vice presidents; Bradley Hyman, secretary and Larry Zahn, treasurer. We are very pleased to announce that, thanks in major part to a presentation last year by Sue Barnes, then Director of the retirement center at UCLA, our pursuit in collaboration with the UCR Retirees Assn. has borne fruit. Chancellor Wilcox has committed \$100,000 in startup funding for a two-year, half-time, Retirement Center director. CUCRA/CUCEA Meeting Report – Oct. 2019

**Regular Meetings:** The UCI Executive Committee holds monthly meetings (October through May) to which all UCI Emeriti are invited at the Newkirk Alumni Center building where our UCI Center for Emeriti and Retirees (CER) is housed on the UCI campus.

**Enhancing Emeriti Engagement:** Throughout this year, we have continued the initiative begun last year to promote greater engagement of our emeriti/ae in the activities of the campus. As previously reported, UCIEA proposed and gained broad support from campus and Senate leadership for ten suggestions that enhance the linkages between the emeriti and their departments, schools and the campus community.

Among our other engagement suggestions, several Schools now periodically administer a special survey of emeriti activity and interests and there is increased attention to the accomplishments of emeriti in School-based newsletters.

Our President, Vice President and Faculty Retirement Liaison are active in another round of one-on-one meetings with each School Dean to assess the School's progress in moving forward on the various suggestions in our Engagement Strategy.

We publicized the UC Emeriti Activity Survey to all major officers on our campus, to include an analysis and report on the UCI emeriti/ae data.

**Faculty Retirement Liaison:** UCI has a part-time recall position whose role includes advising pre-retirement faculty on how to arrange the transition to retirement with their Deans and Chairs, helping emeriti/ae with any issues or problems, and advocating for emeriti/ae on policy issues at the system-wide and campus levels. Emeritus Professor Bill Parker currently holds this position.

**Outstanding Emeritus:** We are pleased to announce that Professor Emeritus Kenneth Baldwin, Physiology & Biophysics, who came to UCI in 1973, has been named the 2019 UCI Outstanding Emeritus. The award will be presented at the UCIEA Annual Meeting to be held December 11, 2019.

**Complimentary Parking:** A major accomplishment has been the extension of an agreement coordinated with campus officials to extend the **complimentary parking pilot program** on the Irvine campus for those emeriti and retirees who belong to either the UCIEA or UCIRA.

**UCIEA Graduate Student Award:** Our Executive Committee is exploring contributing to an award to assist a student in completing his/her dissertation.

## UC Berkeley Retirement Center Report, Submitted by Cary Sweeney, Director October 2019

**Personnel Update:** Rachel Bell, recent graduate of the UCB School of Public Health has been hired as Program Manager for the Retirement Center. Rachel has been working for the Center as a graduate student. In her new position she will continue coordinating the pilot of the Emeriti Academy, the Berkeley Home Match program and assisting with other projects like the Legacy video project, and Age Equity for All.

**Emeriti Academy:** The Executive Vice Chancellor and Provost has provided support to pilot an Emeriti Academy. The aim of the Academy is to support emeriti who are or who want to be engaged in projects that help our students, disciplines, campus, and community. The Academy will connect emeriti from across campus to engage in collaborative work that can involve teaching, research, or creative practice. The Emeriti Academy Working Group met this summer to further develop the proposal and begin framing the infrastructure, with input from [Emeriti Representatives](#), campus administrative. Emeriti Academy Working Group members include: Amy Block Joy, Incoming Emeriti Association President, John Swartzberg, Outgoing Emeriti Association President, Shelly Zedeck, Professor Emeritus, Psychology, Todd LaPorte, Professor Emeritus, Political Science, Angy Stacy, Associate Vice Provost for Faculty, Cary Sweeney, Retirement Center Director, and Rachel Bell, Retirement Center Program Manager. **UC Retiree Learning Series (UCRLS):** Last year the Retirement Center successfully launched the UC Retiree Learning Series with 11 lectures. The series was created as a way to provide retirees with off-campus learning opportunities, and a chance to explore Bay Area retirement communities. The series is underwritten by the host retirement community hosts and faculty provide their lecture at no cost in support of the Center. **Age Equity for All:** A committee of retirees, Cal undergraduate students and Ashby Village volunteers meet monthly to identify collaborations to raise awareness of ageism issues. This fall, the group will partner with Dcal students leaders of the course “Sociology of Aging: Living, Aging, Dying,” to lead a session, offering an intergenerational storytelling seminar with retirees and students.

**Berkeley Home Match Pilot:** The Retirement Center received a seed grant from the Chancellor’s Community Partnership Fund in Fall 2018. The Berkeley Home Match (BHM) program shows great promise with strong numbers: 135 applications received (24 Homeowners/62 Homeseekers); 17 homeowners currently available; 23 people involved in matching; and 10 matches. The average price students are paying in BHM is ~ 45% below the current average rent price for a room a Berkeley home. Anecdotally, we learned that the homeowner and student meet daily for meals to practice the student’s English and discuss their shared interest in law. Our next steps are to continue fine-tuning our process and to seek additional partnerships and funding to further scale out the program.

**Belmont Village Albany Senior Living Community:** The community is almost to capacity. The Retirement Center continues our ongoing collaboration with Belmont Village through multi-generational programming, staff education, and connections to learning opportunities both on campus and at Belmont. Recently joining the Belmont staff is UC Berkeley student art intern, Patricia Huang, a participant at Belmont's student art gallery last fall. This is a permanent paid position at Belmont Village and will rotate each semester.

**Faculty Retirement Transition Seminars:** Partnering with Emeriti Professors Shelly Zedeck, Carolyn and Phil Cowan, Department of Psychology, and Angelica Stacy, Associate Vice Provost for the Faculty, the Retirement Center successfully piloted a 2-part seminar for faculty planning for retirement. This program will be offered for the 2019-20 fall and spring semesters. Topics include: how to continue your academic interests, your relationships with your non-retiring colleagues, what will this transition be like for your family. [Link to flyer.](#)

**Emeriti Legacy Video Project update:** Two of four interviews have been completed this summer: Al Riley, Psychology and Robert Alter, Near Eastern Studies and Comparative Literature; Interviews are scheduled for: Eleanor Swift, Law and David Wake, Integrative Biology.
