## UC San Diego Emeriti Association Report Fall 2023

Dues for annual single and life single memberships remain at \$30 and \$300, respectively. Couple annual and couple life memberships are \$40 and \$400, respectively. However, new joiners are offset by attrition and deaths. The current membership sits at 500.

During the academic year, the UCSD Emeriti Association offers a monthly academic seminar via Zoom. These lectures are open to all Emeriti members as well as to current faculty and academics and to members of the UCSD Retirement Association. Advertisements of the lectures are distributed via Academic Flyer to all UCSD academics. Speakers are faculty members from the full range of academic disciplines and are presented at levels of technical detail accessible to nonexperts. Seminars since March 2020 have been presented via Zoom. Attendance at these monthly Zoom seminars often reaches over 50 participants synchronously, with an additional 200 to 300 members viewing the video recordings afterward. All UCSD Emeriti Association monthly lectures are recorded and are available on the Emeriti Association playlist on the Retiree & Emeriti YouTube Channel. Emeriti Association members enjoy having access to an online event EA RSVP website, with detailed event flyers and a user-friendly online registration tool which generates a confirmation email upon registration.

The very popular Emeriti Association's Book Club meets once per month, via Zoom or in-person, to discuss a book selected by one of the Book Club members. The member who proposes the book also serves as lead discussant at that meeting.

The UCSD Emeriti Association's <u>Emeriti Mentor Program</u> (EMP) sponsors the <u>Chancellor's Scholars Program</u> (CSP) to provide first generation college students, two years of communication and leadership training, as well as one-on-one mentoring. Some <u>forty-eight emeriti faculty serve as mentors</u> to thirty seven freshmen and forty second-year mentees. Many mentors continue with their mentees for the entire 4-year undergraduate experience. Participation in this program has enriched the experience for mentors as well as their mentees.

In addition to their mentoring activities, UCSD Emeriti Association members donated to the UCSD Emeriti Chancellor's Scholarship fund. The Spring Donor Recognition dinner for generous emeriti donors to the Emeriti Chancellor's Scholarship fund was held on April 28 at the UCSD Faculty Club, and donors were able to meet and hear directly from students who benefited from scholarship donations. At the CSP Closing Reception on May 31, a total of six study abroad scholarships were awarded. These scholarships were designated for Chancellor's Scholars only, through the generosity of Emeriti Association donors who wanted to make scholars' dreams of studying abroad a reality.

The UCSD Emeriti Association delivered its Dickson Awards at the EA Annual Meeting on May 10 to <u>Professor Emeritus</u> <u>Richard (Dick) Attiyeh</u> and <u>Dean Emeritus Peter Cowhey</u>, recognizing their long history of continued service.

The Emeriti Association continues its close partnership with the UCSD Retirement Association. This relationship is supported by the excellent coordination efforts of the UCSD Retirement Resource Center. The Director, Vania Bailon, leads a dynamic part-time staff made up of Chancellor's Scholars, who gain employment as student interns, and one additional full time Chancellor's Scholars Program coordinator, Jennifer Homrich.

Emeriti Association members participate in the Retirement Association's many Zoom programs, which are recorded and appear on the Retiree & Emeriti YouTube Channel, with 200+ programs and more than 40,000 views. Emeriti faculty also give lectures as part of the <u>RA Faculty Lecture Series</u> held via Zoom for the UCSD RA. Emeriti Association members have become active participants in many RA activities such as a wide array of senior and financial education seminars and discussion forums.

The Emeriti Association's website was redesigned in 2018 by a Chancellor's Scholar and RRA Founding Director Suzan Cioffi and is a valuable resource for current and prospective members.
